

# London

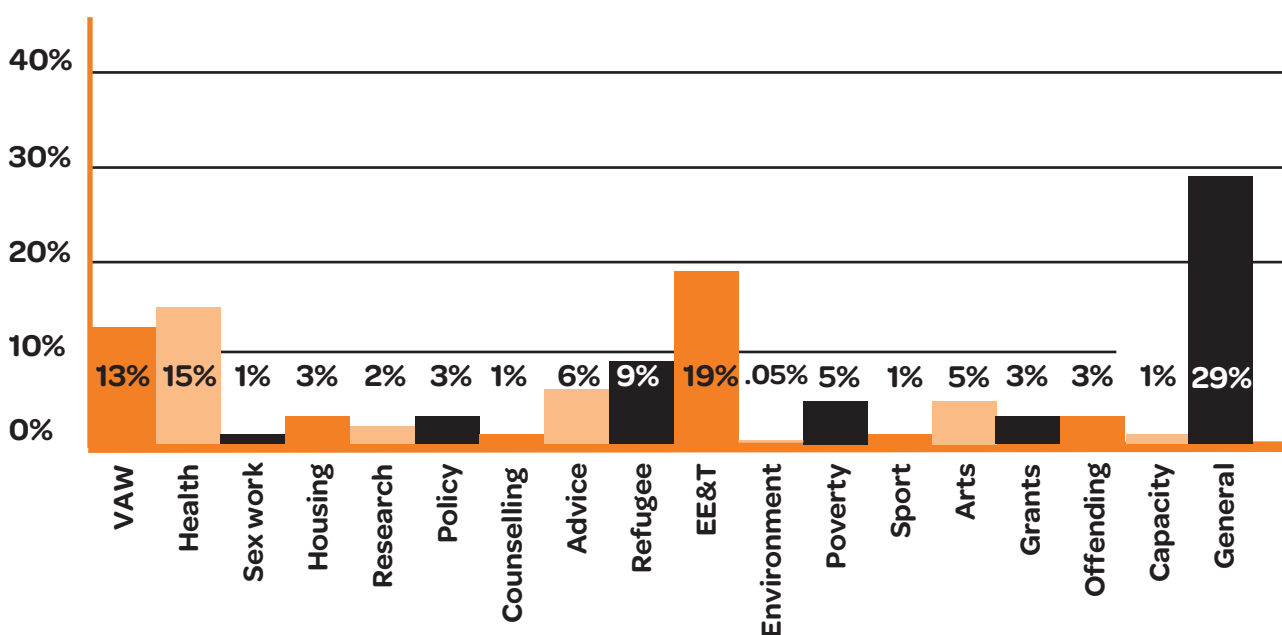
The research identified 448 women's organisations based in the London region. Data from these organisations was used to determine areas of work and organisations that specifically worked with women from different equalities strands.

Half of these organisations had financial data for 2004/05, 2005/06 and 2006/07 so all income and expenditure figures are based on 225 organisations.

## Areas of work

Of the 448 organisations identified, almost a third (29%) delivered 'general' services to women. Almost one in five organisations (19%) provided education, employment and training (EE&T) activities. Fifteen per cent worked in the health field, and 13% delivered violence against women (VAW) services.

Most VAW organisations (77%) delivered domestic violence services.

Forty-one per cent of health organisations provided general health services. Thirty-nine per cent worked in a specialised health area such as pregnancy, mental health or substance misuse.

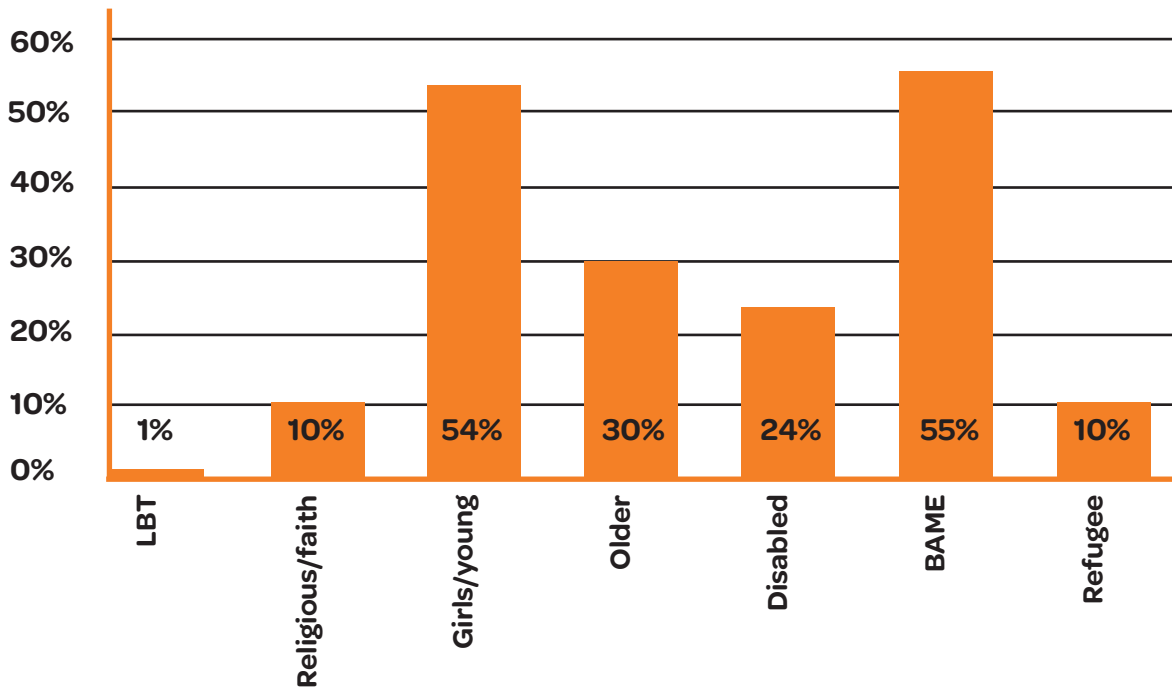

## Equalities

Fifty-seven per cent of organisations worked specifically with Black, Asian and minority ethnic (BAME) women and 54% with girls and young women. Only five organisations in London worked with lesbian, bisexual and/or trans (LBT) women.

**Figure LDN 2: Percentage of organisations working with specific equalities strands**

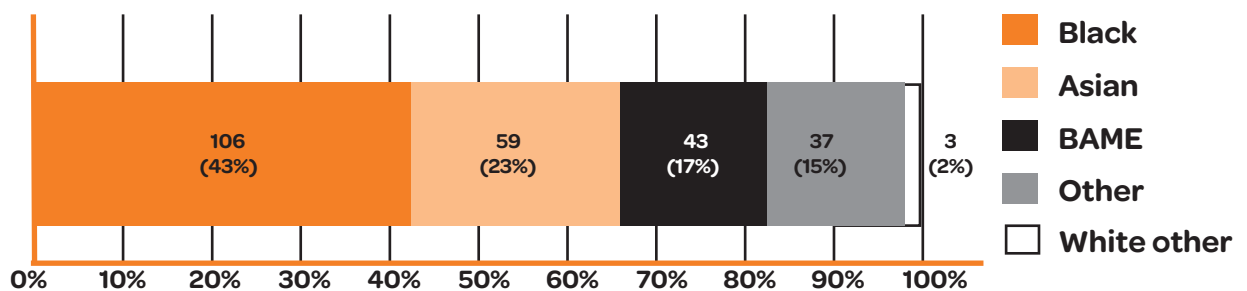

Of the 248 organisations that focused on minority ethnic communities, 106 (43%) worked specifically with Black women.

## Income and expenditure

All information related to income and expenditure is based on the financial data of 225 organisations (half of all London organisations identified).

The difference between income and expenditure narrowed steadily. Eleven per cent of income remained unspent in 2004/05, decreasing to 6% the following year. In 2006/07, only 2% of income was not spent.

Income grew by 13% from 2004/05 to 2005/06 and by 10% from 2005/06 to 2006/07, but spending increased by 19% and 15% during the same period.

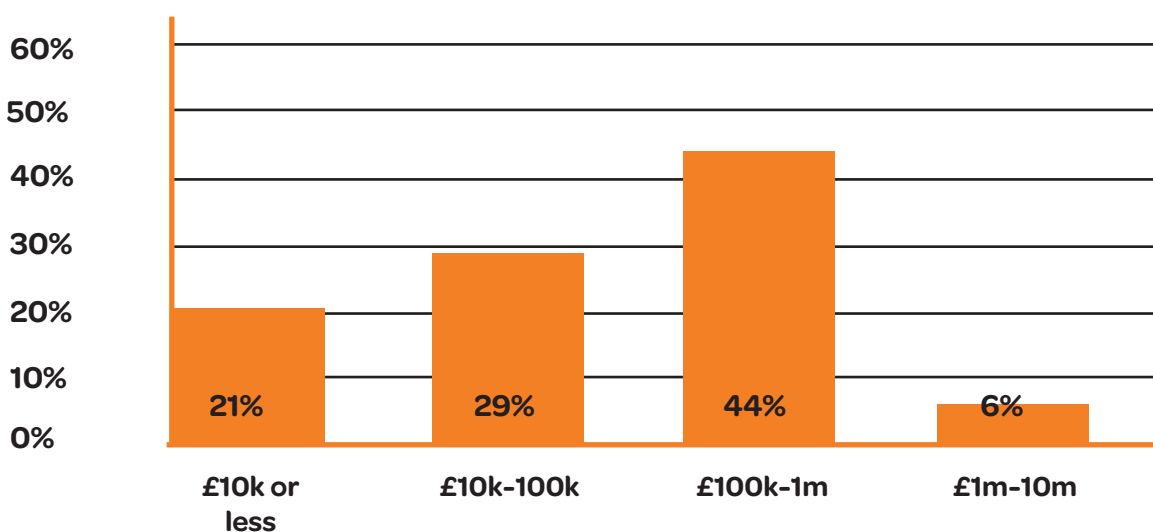

## Income band

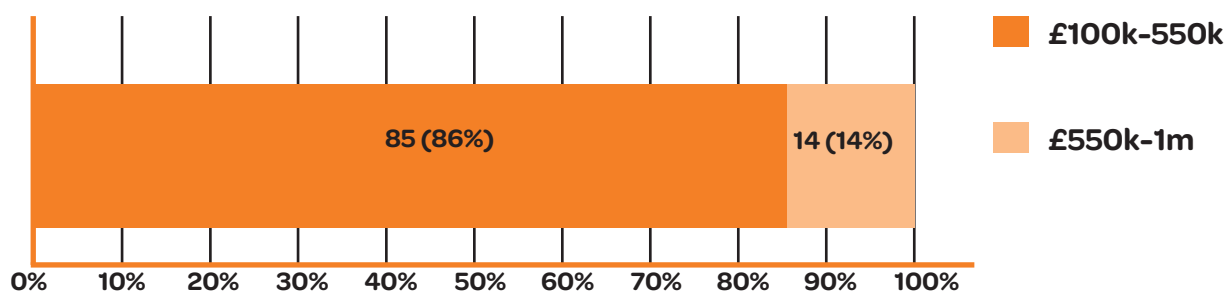
In 2006/07, one in five organisations (21%) had an income of £10k or less, almost a third (29%) had an income between £10-£100k, and 99 organisations (44%) in the London region were in the £100k -1m income band. Just 6% of organisations had an income between £1m -10m.

Of the 99 organisations in the £100k-1m band, only 14 had an annual income over £550k.

## Average income

The average income in the £1m-10m band remained largely unchanged over the three year period. However, the average income in the £10k or less band fell each year, particularly from 2005/06 to 2006/07 where the average income almost halved (48%).

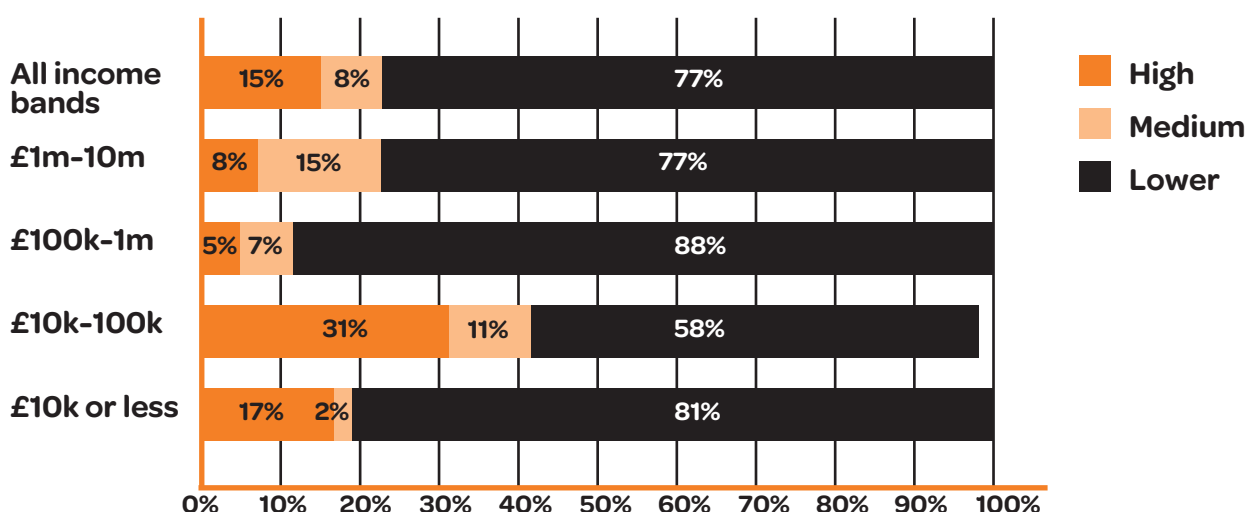
## Income volatility

Organisations in the £10k-100k or less annual income band in 2006/07 were proportionately more likely to experience high or medium income volatility (42%). Almost a quarter of organisations (23%) in the £1m-10m income band experienced high or medium volatility.

Over half (59%) of organisations with high income volatility experienced decreases in income of 40% or more. For example, one organisation's income decreased from £7.441m in 2004/05, to £3.732m the following year, to £6.266m in 2006/07. Another organisation went from £14k to £20k to £24k during this period.

Twenty-six of the 174 organisations in the lower income volatility category (12%) experienced decreases in income every year.
